



Can you match the names of these animals with the names of their offspring?



CRAFTY CORNER

CUPID'S BOW & ARROW SET

You will need:

Sticks

(including a bendy one)

String

Coloured Card

Scissors

Sellotape

Pencil



1. To make the bow, take a bendy stick and tie a piece of string tightly from the top end to the bottom end.

2. To make the arrows, cut 2 small heart shapes out of pink card and sellotape them on to one end of a straight stick. On the other end, attach a rectangular piece of white card and cut notches out of it.



3. If you have a kitchen roll tube, you can make an arrow holder (or quiver). Just sellotape a card disc over one end so they don't fall out! Why not decorate your tube too?



4. To make the targets, cut out two large hearts from your pink and red card. Fold the tops over 2cm, turn the hearts over and repeat until you have formed concertina hearts. Cut holes through the centres and slide sticks through.

5. To set up your targets just push them into the ground outside, load your bow with your arrows and get firing.

sugar

Makes 6 pancakes.

- 1) Whisk the flour, eggs, milk and vegetable oil together in a bowl to form a batter
- 2) Warm a drizzle of oil in a medium frying pan on a medium heat
- 3) Pour a ladle full of batter into the pan and spread to form a thin layer. Cook for 1 minute each side or until golden brown.
- 4) Serve with lemon wedges and a sprinkle of caster sugar.
